SECTION IV – Hardship Policy: It is not the intent of the JRC to prevent any child from participating in any program(s) if the parent, guardian, or responsible adult cannot afford the fees for such a program(s).

If, due to an economic situation, the parent, guardian, or responsible adult cannot pay for a child's participation in a program, the parent, guardian, or responsible adult will need to explain the particular hardship prior to the start date of the program and submit that explanation to the Program Chairperson, in writing. The Program Chairperson will then review the hardship request and indicate (by signature and date) that he or she has read it. The hardship request will then be sent immediately to the designated JRC Board Member who will review the request and either approve or disapprove it. All information provided to the Board is held in strict confidence and will not, under any circumstances, be discussed with any others outside the Board or the Program Chairperson.

NOTE: Travel Programs are not eligible for hardship consideration.
